## Materials List suggested list, to be discussed on first day of class

- For Oils:
  - o The paints you are already using
  - o Medium (Liquin or any other)
  - o Odorless turpentine or similar
  - o Palette no smaller than 18x14
  - o Palette knife
  - o Mark-making tools: charcoal, oil or dry pastels, pencils of different thicknesses, Woody pencils, etc.
  - O Brushes you like in a variety of sizes. Be sure to have at least one large brush (relative to your canvas suggested #12)
  - o Three or four 18x18 or 20x20 canvases or wood panels. If wood panels, gesso them first. 9. One wood panel (Home Depot)or dispose bee canvas for "slop/leftover" paint 10. Collage material (optional)
  - o Paper towels
  - o Stencils (optional)
- For Acrylics:
  - o 1. The paints you are already using
  - O Water or acrylic medium you normally use
  - Water spritzer and container
  - o Palette not smaller than 18x14
  - Palette knife
  - o Brushes in a variety of sizes. Be sure to have at least one large brush (relative to your canvas suggested #12) 7. Three or four 18x18 or 20x20 canvases or wood panels. If wood panels, gesso them first. 8. One wood panel (Home Depot) or disposable canvas for "slop" paint
  - o Collage material (optional)
  - Mark-making tools: charcoals, dry pastels, Woody pencils, regular pencils in different thicknesses, etc.
  - o Paper towels
  - o Stencils (optional)

NOTE: You do **not** need to bring both oils and acrylics, some artists like to use both, but you may choose one to use for this course.
